Released in 1968, *Rojo Amanecer* follows a Mexican middle class family through the atrocities committed by army forces against students protesting the 1968 Olympic games. On October 2, 1968 in Mexico City, a small student revolt turns into a what is known today as the Tlatelolco Massacre. Political turmoil surrounding the atmosphere of the event, resulted in the murder of hundreds of people in the city square.
