The MA in Digital Humanities at Loyola University Chicago applies methods of computational technologies to transform how we ask—and seek to answer— humanistic questions. Our students gain a theoretical understanding of how technology shapes our experiences, while developing practical knowledge for use in their chosen profession.

Our students arrive from different fields and disciplines, including literary studies, history, computer science, communications, and library and information science. They come from diverse cultures and backgrounds, and find a home at Loyola's interdisciplinary research center, the Center for Textual Studies and Digital Humanities (CTSDH), where they undertake research projects, present public programs, and gather socially.

In our 30-hour part-time or full-time program, our students are trained in the practice and critical study of the intersections between the humanities and computational social science. Coursework and research projects range from digital textual editing, archiving, publishing, and data analysis, to the study of new media. Students collaborate with world-renowned faculty and curators before embarking on a capstone project of their own design.

MA in Digital Humanities graduates are prepared for careers in the private and academic sectors, including education, libraries, archives, museums, tech firms, and PhD programs.
