Postpartum depressive (PPD) symptoms in study one were examined in low-income minority women with a low birth weight infant. Forty-two percent of our sample was at risk for depression and PPD symptoms were significantly related to infant health, maternal stress, and maternal anxiety. Prenatal depressive symptoms in study two were examined in an urban low-income African American sample in the second and third trimester of pregnancy. Twenty-three percent of the sample was at risk for depression and women with low oxytocin levels had increased prenatal depressive symptoms.

I. Teaching/Advising

Teaching:

LUC GNUR 294 Pharmacology (undergraduate) 2016 – 2020 Description: This course introduces student nurses to pharmacology and provides them

with the foundation needed to administer medications. The principles of pharmacokinetics, pharmacodynamics, and safe, legal, and ethical medication administration are applied to the pharmacotherapy of common health care problems across the lifespan. Role: Primary instructor for two three-hour sections each semester. Educated students on principles of medicine while relating this new knowledge to nursing and the students future professional role. The course includes lecture, tests, case studies, engagement with students, and group participation.

LUC GNUR 293 Pathophysiology (undergraduate)

2017 - 2019

Description: This course provides the student with knowledge of the basic mechanisms involved in pathophysiological processes. The impact of age, gender, genetics, genomics, life style, and the environment are applied to various pathophyiological states. Role: Primary instructor for two four-hour sections each semester. Educated students on disease processes and how examples of these disease states that nurses will encounter. Instruction includes lecture, test strategies, tests, case studies, tests, and student involvement.

LUC GNUR 102 Introduction to Nursing (undergraduate)

2018

Description: The course introduces the mission of the Marcella Niehoff School of Nursing and the foundations of nursing practice. Nursing is presented as a scientific profession with a heritage of strong values-based leadership, based on critical thinking and evidence-based practice. Role: Primary instructor for one 3 hour section. Instruction included papers, projects, gourp work, presentations, and lectures with student participation and engagement.

LUC GNUR 361 Nursing Ethics (undergraduate)

2017, 2018

Description: This course offers students, as future health care professionals and as health care recipients, opportunities to think philosophically, demonstrate ethical awareness, do ethical reflection, and apply ethical principles in decision-making. Role: Primary instructor for one three-hour section. Educated students on ethical principles, led discussion of case studies, lecture, and real life ethical examples from media.
