Michael Welker received a PhD in Systematic Theology at the University of Tübingen under the direction of Prof. Jürgen Moltmann and another PhD at the University of Heidelberg under the supervision of Prof. Dieter Henrich. From 1983 to 1987 he was professor for Systematic Theology in Tübingen, from 1987-1991 he held the chair for Reformed Theology in Münster, and since 1991 he has been professor for Dogmatics in Heidelberg. From 1996-2006 he was director of the Internationales Wissenschaftsforum Heidelberg (IWH), and since 2005 he has been managing director of the Forschungszentrum Interdisziplinäre Internationale und Theologie (FIIT) in Heidelberg, which he also co-founded. Since 2006 he has been building a Global Network of Research Centers for Theology, Religious and Christian Studies. An ordained minister in the Protestant Church in Germany (EKD), Prof Welker is a member of the Chamber of Theology of its Council and a judge at its Constitutional Court.
