## **Biographical Sketch**

Henry J. Hyde was born on April 18, 1924, in Chicago, IL. Elected as a Republican, he served as an Illinois state representative from 1967-1974. During this period he served as majority leader, 1971-1972, and a delegate to the Illinois state Republican conventions, 1958-1974. Hyde was elected to the Ninety-fourth and subsequent fifteen U.S. Congresses, 1975-2007. Hyde acted as the chair for the Committee on the Judiciary for the 104th-106th Congresses, as well as the chair for the Committee on International Relations for the 107th-109th Congresses.

Mr. Hyde passed away on November 29, 2007, in Chicago, IL.

## **Scope & Content**

The Henry J. Hyde papers contain 375.25 linear feet spanning the years 1923-2008 (bulk 1961-2008) and include correspondence, speeches, notes, reference materials, appointment books, reports, news clippings, House resolutions/bills/etc. press releases,

memorabilia, publications, audio cassettes, videos, films and photographs relating to his tenure as a U.S. Congressman.

**Sub-series 2: Chicago Airports, 1987-2006, Box 56-68**

Sub-series includes news clippings, reference materials, correspondence, reports, and statements.

**Sub-series 3: Flooding, 1972, 1985-2001, Boxes 68-71**

Sub-series includes reference materials, correspondence, and news clippings regarding flooding emergencies in the Chicago area and government assistance.

**Sub-series 4: Iran-Contra Affair, 1984-1991, Box 72-81**

Sub-series includes news clippings, published transcripts of the Joint Hearings on the Iran-Contra Investigation, and published reports of the Congressional Committees Investigating the Iran-Contra Affair. Committee files related to the investigation were moved to the Restricted Series.

**Sub-series 5: October Surprise Task Force, 1979-1993, Box 82-83**

Sub-series includes press coverage, news clippings, and magazine articles. Hyde was the Vice-Chairman of the House October Surprise Task Force. The rest of the

materials (1.5 linear feet) were moved to the Restricted Series as committee files.

**Restrictions:** Committee files have been restricted.

**Separations:** Less than 0.25 linear feet of materials related to the Iran-Contra Investigation were moved to the Restricted Series. 1.5 linear feet of committee files from the October Surprise Task Force were moved to the Restricted Series.

#### **Series 4: Legislative, 1982-2006, Boxes 84-105**

Series includes correspondence, news clippings, reference materials, reports, publications, and remarks related to international issues and foreign countries.

##### **Sub-series 1: Bills & Resolutions, 1982-1989, Boxes 84-87**

Sub-series includes House resolutions, House bills, House joint resolutions, and House concurrent resolutions.

##### **Sub-series 2: Legislative Research, 1982-2006, Boxes 88 -105**

Sub-series includes reference materials, correspondence, news clippings, briefing books, and other documents supporting research on legislative matters.

**Restrictions:** None

**Separations:** none

#### **Series 5: Constituent Correspondence, 1991, 1997-2001, Boxes 106-112**

Series is arranged chronologically by date of when correspondence was received. It includes letters and e-mails from constituents and responses from Hyde's office regarding a variety of topics. Folders covering one topic/bill have been noted.

**Restrictions:** None

**Separations:** This series was sampled preserving 20% of the original files. Every fifth file was retained and the remaining files (approximately 13 linear feet) were destroyed.

#### **Series 6: International Relations Committee, 2003-2006, Box 113**

Series includes committee correspondence, news clippings, remarks, press releases, and talking points.

**Restrictions:** Committee files are closed for 30 years from the creation date.

**Separations:** Approximately 3.5 linear feet of committee records were moved to the Restricted Series.

**Series 7: Judiciary Committee, 1985-2004, Boxes 114-121**

Series includes news clippings, committee prints, articles, reports, and published materials.

**Sub-series 1: Flag Protection, 1967, 1989-2001, Boxes 114-115**

Sub-series includes reference materials, House Resolutions, news clippings, reports, and remarks.

**Sub-series 2: President Clinton Impeachment, 1997-2002, Boxes 115-121**

Sub-series includes news clippings, reference materials, correspondence, articles, reports, and committee prints. Items in this sub-series are open to research. Restricted materials related to the Clinton impeachment have been moved to the Restricted Series.

**Restrictions:** Committee files are closed for 30 years from the creation date.

**Separations:** Approximately 0.5 linear feet of duplicates were removed. 6 linear feet of restricted materials regarding the Clinton Impeachment investigation and 2 linear feet of committee records were moved to the Restricted Series.
