Loyola has the honor of bringing to campus the Spanish Golden Age Theater Company, Cambalache, founded in 1986 by Francisco García Vicente, director, set designer, and faculty member at the Facultad de Bellas Artes of the University of Murcia and at the Escuela Superior de Arte Dramático in Murcia, Spain. The company will be at the Loyola Lakeshore Campus from March 10-March 14, 2014 and will be visiting classes, giving workshops on Classical Spanish dance, poetic/dramatic reading, improvisation, and theatrical techniques. They will perform a contemporary adaptation in Spanish of the Calderón de la Barca play entitled “El secreto a voces.” The performance will be on Friday, March 14, at 4:00 PM in Mullady Theatre and is free for Loyola students, faculty, and staff. The play is set in the court of the Dutchess of Parma where everyone keeps the “secret” until it is finally revealed, causing havoc. A bilingual Q & A session conducted by Dr. Héctor García will follow the performance.
