### Exploring environmental science and communication

Environmental degradation is one of the most daunting challenges of the 21st century, and therefore requires people with specialized training to facilitate and communicate impactful solutions.

Loyola University Chicago's School of Environmental Sustainability and the School of Communication are partnering to offer unique interdisciplinary dual-degree programs designed to train environmental scientists to be better communicators, and communication professionals to better understand environmental science.

### Earn a bachelor's and a master's degree in five years

Students working on a BA/BS in the School of Environmental Sustainability enroll in a 4+1 program to earn either an MC in Digital Media and Storytelling or an MS in Global Strategic Communication from the School of Communication.

Students working on a BA in the School of Communication (Communication Studies, Advocacy & Social Change, Advertising & Public Relations, Advertising Creative, Multimedia Journalism, or Film and Digital Media) enroll in a 4+1 program to earn an MS in Environmental Science and Sustainability from the School of Environmental Sustainability.

### Knowledge and training to launch your career

For students in the School of Environmental Sustainability, the 4+1 program helps improve writing, public speaking, conference presentations, television and radio interviews, and social media messaging.

For students in the School of Communication, the 4+1 program develops better-informed journalists, documentary filmmakers, television, radio and podcast producers, public relations and advertising professionals, and social media specialists.
